# ABSTRACTS OF SEASON REPORTS.

SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1905.

#### WESTERN PROVINCE.

COLOMBO DISTRICT.

Paddy: yala crops have been harvested. A fairly good maha crop is generally expected.

Dry grain: no cultivation worth reporting.

Other products: the supply of vegetables and fruit was good and prices were fair.

Prices of staple products: rice, Rs. 3 to Rs. 5 a bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 30 to Rs. 45 a thousand.

Rainfall: the rainfall during the month was not above the average.

Remarks on harvest prospects generally: the yala harvest was generally good, and a fairly good maha crop may be generally expected.

Observations on the health of the inhabitants: with the exception of a few cases of fever, chickenpox, and dysentery in some parts of the district, the health of the inhabitants was generally good.

#### KALUTARA DISTRICT.

Paddy: preparations for maha are in progress. In some places in the totamunes sowing has been completed.

Dry grain: none, except a few patches of amu and meneri, which have been sown on new clearings, and which are thriving.

Other products: fruits and vegetables are becoming scarce.

Price of staple articles of diet: rice, Rs. 4 to Rs. 6 per bushel; cocoanuts, Rs. 30 to Rs. 35 per 1,000 in the totamunes and Rayigam korale, Rs. 40 in Pasdun Korale West, and Rs. 50 to Rs. 60 in Pasdun Korale East.

Harvest prospects generally: no opinion can be expressed yet.

Rainfall: there was very heavy rain everywhere during the first half of the month.

Rainfall at Kalutara: total 18:49 in.; mean .59 in.

Health of people: the health of the people has been on the whole satisfactory. There were fourteen cases of smallpox in Rayigam korale of which one proved fatal, but the disease was prevented from spreading, and the remaining patients have recovered. There were also a few cases of fever, dysentery, and chickenpox.

Health of cattle: hoof-and-mouth disease broke out in some villages in the totamunes, Rayigam korale,

and Pasdun Korale West; some of the animals were treated by the Government Veterinary Department, and to the owners of the other animals disinfectants have been distributed.

#### MATALE DISTRICT.

Rainfall registered at Matale: 10.96 in.

Paddy: yala harvest being gathered; maha cultivation is in course of cultivation.

Dry grain: maha chenas are being cleared and sown in some places.

Tanks in Matale North are dry.

Health of people: good, few cases of chickenpox and dysentery occurred in some places.

Health of cattle: good.

Prices: moderate.

# NORTHERN PROVINCE.

# JAFFNA DISTRICT.

Rainfall: 11.58 in., as registered at the Public Works Department Office, Jaffna.

Weather: fine and clear during half of the month, and threatening weather and rain during the other

Paddy cultivation: paddy fields are in plants everywhere. Some fields were flooded with rain water in the first half of the month, which prevented the germination of the seeds. The fields which were sown before are in plants which have withered considerably for want of rain during the latter half of the month.

Dry grain cultivation: kurakkan and karuttasamy were reaped and their harvest is fair.

Tobacco cultivation: nil.

Health of people: satisfactory; fever and diarrhea, however, prevail in some parts.

Health of cattle: good.

Prices of staple articles: paddy, Re. 1.87 per bushel; rice, Rs. 4.50 per bushel; chamy, Re. 1.50 per bushel.

# MANNAR DISTRICT.

Weather: rainfall registered at Mannar town was 8:16 in. The fall was however partial. While the tanks near the sea board had more than enough, those higher up had not sufficient water for sowing the fields under them.
